Area 82 Guidelines Updating The suggestion was made at the Service Weekend to create a Literature Committee that could look after annual changes to the Guidelines to be brought forward to each Fall Assembly for approval. To that end, the floor is now open for discussion on the creation of an Area 82 Literature Committee. New Business 1. Possible Area 82 Guidelines Amendment: Dwayne introduced this discussion regarding the possibility of someone from outside the geographic area of a host District be elected to a service position for said District through an online meeting format. For example, in an online meeting in District 1, someone from Vancouver let's their name stand for the position of GSR. Is this acceptable or do we need to discuss a 'residency requirement'? 2. Succession Planning: After much discussion and idea sharing and data collection from numerous members, we are ready to promote service positions to existing and potential trusted servants by providing additional information on our website pertaining to both position descriptions and the sharing of the experience, strength and hope of existing trusted servants who have provided valuable insights into their shared experiences in a variety of roles. It is hoped that this information will help to build an informed individual and group conscience when deciding to offer for future positions. 3. Request from District 7: "Members at the Fall Assembly in Corner Brook must be present and in-person in order to vote on motions" 4. Request from District 1 – Maria R. Requesting that a new pamphlet be made available for people with limited reading skills or that the pamphlet: "Access to AA: Members Share on Overcoming Barriers" be updated to include stories from AA members with literacy limitation skills, in other words, people who can't read.
